1. Call to Order: Sherry Waddell called meeting to order.

2. Roll Call:

3. Approval of Minutes:

Art Spurr requested that minutes reflect the concerns he raised about Francis Knight's appointment. Minutes will be revised and brought back to the Committee.

4. Business:

- a.** The Committee unanimously agreed to recommend to the Town Council to appoint Frances Knight as a full Committee member, and appoint Joseph Carteret as an alternate Committee member.

- b. The Committee agreed to reschedule the September 5th Committee meeting to September 9th pending the availability of Lt. Coble.

5. Discussion:

- a. **Discussion of CERT Program:** The Committee had a brief discussion on the CERT program and will wait until Lt. Coble can attend to discuss further.
- b. **ATV Recreational Vehicle:** Art Spurr discussed proposed changes in the law that regulate ATV vehicles. Art Spurr will look into a future fee structure for ATV regulations. Art Spurr proposed to use Crooked Creek Park as an ATV park. Francis Knight requested that Art Spurr write an ordinance and bring back to Sept 9th meeting.
- c. **Street Parking:** Frances Knight discussed her concerns with street parking, and discussed Lake Park's street parking ordinance. Frances Knight and Sherry Waddell will do further research on the topic.

6. Public Comments:

- a. **Jerry Morse:** Suggested that street parking be looked into further. He thought the wetlands could be a problem in using ATV's in Crooked Creek Park. However, he thought a private ATV would be a good idea. He thought that the meeting minutes could be expanded.
- b. **Michael Faulkenberry:** Discussed several issues to improve communications with residents. He discussed the minutes, Facebook, and meeting with other Committees. He discussed issues related to ATV use, and issues with walkers within the parks.
